Acts 5:29-42 (ESV)

²⁹ But Peter and the apostles answered, "We must obey God rather than men. ³⁰ The God of our fathers raised Jesus, whom you killed by hanging him on a tree. ³¹ God exalted him at his right hand as Leader and Savior, to give repentance to Israel and forgiveness of sins. ³² And we are witnesses to these things, and so is the Holy Spirit, whom God has given to those who obey him."

³³ When they heard this, they were enraged and wanted to kill them. ³⁴ But a Pharisee in the council named Gamaliel, a teacher of the law held in honor by all the people, stood up and gave orders to put the men outside for a little while. ³⁵ And he said to them, "Men of Israel, take care what you

are about to do with these men. ³⁶ For before these days Theudas rose up, claiming to be somebody, and a number of men, about four hundred, joined him. He was killed, and all who followed him were dispersed and came to nothing. ³⁷ After him Judas the Galilean rose up in the days of the census and drew away some of the people after him. He too perished, and all who followed him were scattered. ³⁸ So in the present case I tell you, keep away from these men and let them alone, for if this plan or this undertaking is of man, it will fail; ³⁹ but if it is of God, you will not be able to overthrow them. You might even be found opposing God!" So they took his advice, ⁴⁰ and when they had called in the apostles, they beat them and charged them not to speak in the name of Jesus, and let them go. ⁴¹ Then they left the presence of the council, rejoicing that they were counted worthy to suffer dishonor for the name. ⁴² And every day, in the temple and from house to house, they did not cease teaching and preaching that the Christ is Jesus.

¹⁹ On the evening of that day, the first day of the week, the doors being locked where the disciples were for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood among them and said to them, "Peace be with you." ²⁰ When he had said this, he showed them his hands and his side. Then the disciples were glad when they saw the Lord. ²¹ Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, even so I am sending you." ²² And when he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. ²³ If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven them; if you withhold forgiveness from any, it is withheld."

²⁴ Now Thomas, one of the twelve, called the Twin, was not with them when Jesus came. ²⁵ So the other disciples told him, "We have seen the Lord." But he said to them, "Unless I see in his hands the mark of the nails, and place my finger into the mark of the nails, and place my hand into his side, I will never believe."

²⁶ Eight days later, his disciples were inside again, and Thomas was with them. "The Outcome of Your Faith"

1 Peter 1:3-9

Tune: French. 15th cent.

⁸ Though you have not seen him, you love him. Though you do not now see him, you believe in him and rejoice with joy that is inexpressible and filled with glory, ⁹ obtaining the outcome of your faith, the salvation of your souls.

I pray:

I thank You, my heavenly Father, through Jesus Christ, Your dear Son, that You have kept me this night from all harm and danger; and I pray that You would keep me this day also from sin and every evil, that all my doings and life may please You. For into Your hands I commend myself, my body and soul, and all things. Let Your holy angel be with me, that the evil foe may have no power over me. Amen. (Martin Luther's Small Catechism)

My name is Thomas, and, I bear witness with a long line of saints who have gone before me. Here I stand with Martin Luther and profess that,

I believe that Jesus Christ, true God, begotten of the Father from eternity, and also true man, born of the Virgin Mary, is my Lord, who has redeemed me, a lost and condemned person, purchased and won me from all sins, from death, and from the power of the devil; not with gold or silver, but with His holy, precious blood and with His innocent suffering and death, that I may be His own and live under Him in His kingdom and serve Him in everlasting righteousness, innocence, and

blessedness, just as He is risen from the dead, lives and reigns to all eternity.

This is most certainly true.

He is Risen! He is Risen Indeed. Alleluia!

But, the Apostle Thomas had missed the Memo.

True, the memo was given the past Sunday; but, Thomas was not there. In the memo was the very Word of the Risen Lord who showed Himself as living in both body and soul. But Thomas was not there. Jesus had appeared to the disciples and said, "Peace be with You!" But Thomas was not there.

The disciples were locked down, hiding in fear behind closed doors. Death had taken too many loved ones. And now the One who is Love had died. He was crucified. They fled the scene. Passover's Sabbath had left the streets eerily empty. A few huddled together, away from the crowds. Maybe social isolation would keep death distant from the door. No one knew what was in store. And no one knew where Thomas was, because Thomas was not there.

Thomas did not know the Peace who was now walking in their midst. So, Thomas had no peace in his soul. For fear of death they were locked behind the door. This solitary confinement brings no solitude.

Never mind the locked doors. The Door of Life came in to their midst.

John 20:19 "Jesus came and stood among them and said to them, "Peace be with you." ²⁰ When he had said this, he showed them his hands and his side. Then the disciples were glad when they saw the Lord."

The disciple Peter reflected on this very moment:

^{1 Peter 1:3} Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ! According to his great mercy, he has caused us to be born again to a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead,"

In this pandemic panicked world we hear that the nations are worried about the breath in our life. We hear a lot of wind about the corona that has traveled around the world and threatens to snuff out the light of the world. I know that many are worried about the essential needs of this body and life. Governors and their people are standing sometimes side by side and sometimes toe to toe, but always standing six feet apart over what truly is needed for this body and life.

The Kentucky Governor reflected on March, 24, businesses that will stay open are food and drink, repair and life services. Businesses that will be closed included new sales and furnishings and hobbies.

The doors are closed to many churches; but, churches have arisen as businesses that are essential. Most masses with mass gatherings have closed, but faith, hope and love have spread wide open across countless homes. For the most part church buildings have closed their doors and opened up the airwaves. Faith can't be shut in. Faith in a living Lord is living. Faith in a dead world is dead.

John20:24 Now Thomas, one of the twelve, called the Twin, was not with them when Jesus came. ²⁵ So the other disciples told him, "We have seen the Lord." But he said to them, "Unless I see in his hands the mark of the nails, and place my finger into the mark of the nails, and place my hand into his side, I will never believe."

Thomas likely wondered what possibly could be left after Jesus had died. For Thomas, all was perishable, defiled, and fading. Looking at the world today, we see all goes the way of the grave. And for Thomas, Jesus was in the grave.

Peter knew the old outcome of the body. Death comes to us all. But Peter now knew the new Hope in Christ Jesus. He is Risen! He is Risen indeed! Alleluia! The salvation of our souls is made sure by the resurrection of the body. And His body is no longer in the tomb. My name is Thomas; I know, I put my hand there in Jerusalem.

1 Peter 1:4 shows us a risen Christ who gives us ^{1 Peter 1:4,5} "an inheritance that is imperishable, undefiled, and unfading, kept in heaven for you, who by God's power are being guarded through faith for a salvation ready to be revealed in the last time.

The outcome of our faith? The salvation of our souls.

John20:26 Eight days later, his disciples were inside again, and Thomas was with them. Although the doors were locked, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you." ²⁷ Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here, and see my hands; and put out your hand, and place it in my side. Though you do not now see him, you believe in him and rejoice with joy that is inexpressible and filled with glory, 9 obtaining the outcome of your faith, the salvation of your souls.

He is Risen! He is Risen Indeed! Alleluia!
